Subject: **Special scheme for direct allotment of dealership / distributorship of petroleum products to the next of kin of Mumbai Martyrs.**


Sir,

The undersigned is directed to say that with a view to rehabilitate the next of kin of the 18 Government Security personnel (16 Mumbai Police personnel and 2 NSG personnel) who laid down their lives while fighting the terrorists during 26-28<sup>th</sup> November, 2008 at Mumbai, this Ministry has introduced a special scheme for direct allotment of Retail Outlet (RO) dealership / LPG distributorship / Superior Kerosene Oil – Light Diesel Oil (SKO-LDO) dealership / CNG Filling Station to the identified beneficiaries. A copy of the special scheme and the list of Martyrs are enclosed.

2. The identified beneficiaries have been informed about the special scheme during a function organized by this Ministry at Mumbai on 1.2.2009 to pay homage to the Martyrs, which was attended by Hon'ble Minister (P&NG) and Hon'ble Chief Minister of Maharashtra.

3. You are requested to take immediate necessary action for expeditious implementation of the special scheme.

**Special scheme for allotment of Retail Outlet (RO) Dealerships/ LPG Distributorships/ Superior Kerosene Oil – Light Diesel Oil (SKO-LDO) Dealership/CNG Filling Station to dependents of Government Security Personnel who laid down their lives while fighting with terrorists on November 26-28, 2008 at Mumbai.**

**I. Eligible Beneficiaries**

One of the following dependents of Government Security Personnel who laid down their lives while fighting with terrorists on November 26-28, 2008 at Mumbai in the following order,

- a. Spouse of the deceased.
- b. Son(s)
- c. Unmarried daughter (s)
- d. Parents

**II. Definitions:**

- a. Dealership means
  - i. Petrol/ Diesel Retail outlet.
  - ii. SKO-LDO agency.
  - iii. LPG agency.
- b. Dealer means allottee of dealership as defined in (a) above.
- c. Family Unit : In case of married person it consists of self, spouse and unmarried son(s)/daughter(s) and in case of unmarried person it consists of self, father, mother, unmarried brother(s) and sister(s).
- d. OMCs means Oil Marketing Companies viz. Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL), Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited (HPCL) and Indian Oil Corporation Limited (IOC).

## II. General Eligibility Criteria for Dealership

- a. Citizenship – He/she should be a citizen of India.
- b. Age – A person interested in becoming a dealer should have attained the age of 21 years but not be older than 65 years on the date of allotment of dealership/distributorship.
- c. Health – A dealer should possess sound physical and mental health.
- d. Multiple Dealership Norms – *Only one dealership or CNG Filling Station will be allotted to a “family unit”.*  
If any person in the above “family unit” already has a dealership or holds LOI for a dealership then other person(s) in that “family unit” will not be eligible for new dealership.
- e. No criminal records – A person can not become a dealer if he/she has been convicted for any criminal offence involving moral turpitude / economic offences (other than freedom struggle), and if he/she has been a signatory of any dealership agreement which were terminated by any oil company for proven malpractices / adulteration.
- f. To be an active dealer – A dealer will not be eligible for taking up any other employment. If he/she is already employed, before issuance of Letter of Appointment, he/she should produce the proof of acceptance of his/her resignation by the employer.

## III. Mode of Allotment

- a. Direct allotment of dealership to one of the dependants of Government Security Personnel who laid down their lives while fighting with terrorists on November 26-28, 2008 at Mumbai.

- b. The allotment will be made in favour of the names of eligible widows / dependants recommended by the parent organization of the deceased Government security personnel for the scheme (Department of Home, Govt. of Maharashtra in cases of deceased personnel belonging to Mumbai Police and Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India in cases of deceased personnel belonging to National Security Guard). *In case there is a tie between two or more beneficiaries for a particular product (including CNG Filling Station) or a particular location and oil companies do not find themselves in a position to accommodate all such requests, the matter would be referred to the parent organization for their recommendation.*
- c. The allotment letter issued by the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas will indicate the names of the beneficiaries under the special scheme. The order will not be specific for any product or location. Subsequent to the issuance of allotment letter, a designated team of the officers of OMCs will visit the beneficiaries and seek their choice of product and location (five choices). OMCs will immediately conduct feasibility study of the locations selected. If none of the selected location is found economically viable, then the beneficiaries will be requested again to indicate another three preferences so that an economically viable option is worked out by OMCs in consultation with the beneficiaries. Once a viable option is worked out in consultation with beneficiary, the concerned OMC will issue Letter of Intent (LOI) in favour of the beneficiary within 15 days and commission the dealership/distributorship within 12 months from the date of issue of LOI. The change of location or product will not be permissible once LOI is issued and thus it will be the responsibility of the OMCs as well as beneficiary to identify the location and product after taking utmost care.
- d. Locations finally selected for setting up of dealership under this scheme will be outside the marketing plan of OMCs.

- e. OMCs shall procure suitable sites / godowns, make all necessary investments for construction and other facilities, obtain all requisite approvals from various statutory authorities and then hand over the dealership which is ready for operation, to the beneficiaries.
- f. Allottees under this scheme will also be eligible for Corpus Fund Scheme. Under this scheme, a working capital loan (rate of interest – 11% per annum) to cover full operation cycle will be provided. This loan will be recovered from the beneficiaries in 100 equal installments commencing from the 13<sup>th</sup> month of the commissioning of the dealership.
- g. However, due to the extreme scarcity of suitable land for setting up of dealership in big cities such as Mumbai, Delhi, Chennai, Kolkata, Pune, Bangalore, Hyderabad and Ahemdabad, if any of the beneficiary opts for these cities, he/she should be in possession of suitable land at a viable location in these cities. The onus of arranging the land in these cities will not be on OMCs.
- h. The total number of allotments made under this scheme will be distributed among IOC : HPCL : BPCL in the 50:25:25 ratio. Further, in order to expedite the commissioning of dealerships, OMCs may pool their resources particularly Company Owned Company Operated outlets etc., BPCL will act as Industry coordinator for implementation of this scheme.
- i. Once dealership is commissioned, further terms of operation will be governed by the Dealership Agreement.
